Their senior class play was Spider Island, directed by Sister Bernard Marie. The play had an all-girl cast---but was so well done that no one ever noticed the lack of male roles.

They returned to St. Pat's on Saturday, September 11, 2010 to celebrate the 50th anniversary of their graduation. Principal Randy Hodge greeted the class and gave them a tour of the school. He was assisted by three members of the current senior class, Adrienne Thelen, Rachelle Vallier, and Luke Wilcox.

They attended Mass together, had a wonderful dinner and spent several hours laughing and reminiscing. Congratulations, Class of 1960!

Sister Bernita Marie Gensterblum, CSJ, celebrating 60 Years

Sister Bernita Marie Gensterblum entered the Sisters of St. Joseph on July 1, 1950 from St. Patrick Parish, Portland, Michigan. Teaching assignments brought her to various schools in various cities, as well as teaching CCD religious education classes. After twenty-six years of



teaching, Sister Bernita Marie received training as a physical therapist and came home to Nazareth to assist our sisters in their health care needs.

Sister Martha Ann Oldani, CSJ, celebrating 60 Years

Sister Martha Ann Oldani entered the Sisters of St. Joseph on July 1, 1950 from Guardian Angels Parish, Detroit. Her teaching ministry took her to Michigan schools in Algonac, Flint, Detroit, St. Clair Shores, Hillsdale, Battle Creek, Portland and Taylor. For ten years she worked as a receptionist at St. John Hospital and Medical Center in Detroit. Now Sis-

Sister Adele Donovan, CSJ (formerly Sister Marie Frances), celebrating 75 Years

Sister Adele Donovan entered the Sisters of St. Joseph on February 11, 1935 from St. Philip Neri Parish, Detroit. For forty-six years Sister Adele taught school. She was in Portland in the 1960's. The last ten years of her teaching career were at St. Benedict School in Highland Park. In 1983 she began work at Nazareth Center as a receptionist in the SSJ Health System, remaining at Nazareth to assist in service to the sisters residing there.



In The Spotlight

Anne (Conlon) Eddy

I met Anne (Conlon) Eddy in 1969 when I was a senior at St. Patrick's School. She had been asked to help with the school play, Brigadoon. The play would be a combined effort between the school and the Portland Civic Players. I had a role in the play, and as I got to know Anne, I learned that she had led a very interesting life. I didn't know at the time, that she would become my life long friend!

Anne Conlon was born in Belfast, Ireland. She is the seventh child in a family of 13. While growing up, she and her friend Theresa often talked about emigrating to America.

In 1956, she applied for a job with the Overseas Domestic Scheme, an agency that would find a family in America to pay her way, in exchange for domestic help. Soon Anne was sailing on a ship from Liverpool to New Rochelle, New York to work as a nanny for a Jewish family with three children. The family had dismissed their previous nanny because a 19-year old Irish Catholic girl would work cheaper.

Anne worked for the family for six months, long enough to pay off her debt to them. She then moved on to Detroit, Michigan to work for Detroit Edison. While there, she lived at the home of the League for Catholic Women.

Before coming to America, Anne and her family had befriended a U.S. soldier stationed in Germany. He spent time with them and dated Anne when he was in Ireland on leave. His name was Bill Eddy and he was from Portland, Michigan. The young serviceman

had continued to stay in contact with Anne's mother in Ireland, and Anne thought that since she was now living in Michigan, it would be interesting to meet the Eddy family. She and Bill resumed their courtship and were soon engaged. They were married in 1957 by Father Flohe at St. Patrick's Church. Their two children, Sean (born in 1961) and Maureen (born in 1965) attended and graduated from St. Patrick's School.

In 1965, Anne was asked by the Portland Civic Players to teach the Irish Jig to the cast of players for their production of Finnegans Rainbow. She joined the cast and did the choreography for the play. Little did she know at the time, that this group would become a second family. Anne has directed over 30 plays and appeared on stage in even more. For the past 20 years, she has been a member of the PCP Board, ensuring that PCP continues and grows. Her faithful helpers in this endeavor are her sister Rosemary Leik, who sews costumes and helps anywhere she is needed, and husband Bill, who is talented in building and lighting. Anne has been a recipient of the Portland Civic Play-

er of the Year---Portland's version of the Oscar.

After directing Brigadoon at St. Pat's gymnasium in 1969, Principal Lou LaScala asked Anne to take charge of the Drama Club. She agreed, and kept that job until her daughter Maureen graduated in 1983. Anne considers "Westside Story" to be her crowning achievement during her involvement at St. Pat's, because she had been told that it couldn't be done!

But, Anne's life hasn't been just family and theater! Around 1965, women were finally being allowed to sing in Catholic church choirs. St. Pat's welcomed women in to sing on Sundays and at funerals, though at first the women had to sing from the organ room (the room where confessions are now heard, located on the right side of the altar). After a few years, under the direction of Father Pettit, they were allowed to join the men in the sanctuary. Anne was one of the first women to join the choir. In 1991, she assumed the role of Choir Director of the Sunday and Resurrection Choirs, a role that she continues to this day.

The State of the School

The 2010 – 2011 school year is off to a strong start. Much time and effort was put forth during the summer to ensure the new school year will be a successful one. I would like to give you an update about recent developments at St. Patrick School.

Daycare and Preschool: The Preschool and Daycare programs continue to grow. Last year the Pre-school was full to capacity, so this year we added an additional afternoon session. We currently have a waiting list for our morning program. The daycare numbers have also increased to the point where it has become necessary to add an additional part-time staff member.

DK – 12: Enrollment: The school enrollment continues to grow. School enrollment has grown by 11% since August of 2008. We are excited by the many new students and families who have joined us over the past two years.

Father Flohe Foundation Grant: The Father Flohe Foundation has been a great blessing to the school. They were able to provide a larger than anticipated grant to the school the last two years, which helped to provide a one year tuition freeze last year and assisted in keeping tuition increases to a minimum for this school year.

In addition to stabilizing tuition costs, the Father Flohe Foundation provided the school and parish with the opportunity to upgrade technology. We purchased a new server to give the school and parish more capacity, and will also renovate the older computer lab. As part of the renovation, the wall partition will be removed, a drop ceiling and a multimedia projector will be installed. The computers will be turned to face one direction which will allow staff to use this lab for instruction as well as for research and word process-

ing. We are hoping this will take place over Christmas break. Please continue to support the Father Flohe Foundation, as it provides crucial support for the school.

Shamrock Alumni Scholarship Fund: The Alumni Scholarship Fund was started a few years ago to provide tuition assistance to families who want to send their child to a Catholic School but lacked the financial means to do so. This fund is providing assistance to a number of families and is making the dream of attending St. Patrick School a reality for more than 20 students.

Growing in Faith: The staff at St. Patrick School is committed to helping our students grow in understanding, applying, and being active participants in their Faith. This objective remains the foundation of our parish school.

New Softball Field

The St. Patrick Athletic Association is excited to announce that the Shamrock Softball teams will have their own home field, beginning in the spring of 2011. The softball teams have played on city-owned fields, primarily Powers Park, for the past three decades. Though the city of Portland has been extremely

hospitable to work with, it has become increasingly complicated and difficult to ensure that the field will be available for all of our games and practices.

The new softball field will be lo-

cated near the grove area of Father Flohe Field, in the area where the 8-year old youth baseball teams have played. This new configuration has the added benefit of allowing the Shamrock baseball and softball teams to play side by side, which will add to the spirit and enthusiasm for both games. It will also allow St. Pat's to host tournaments for baseball and softball.

The total cost for this project is project to be around \$10,000. Over 70% of the money has already been donated, through memorials or other donations. The Athletic Association will be working extra hard this year to acquire the rest of the money so that it doesn't affect the rest of their budget.

Standardized Scores-- Excellent, Again!

Test results from the 2010 ACT and MME were released in August. St. Patrick's students did very well, again, scoring the highest in the area in nearly every category!!

American College Test (ACT)

- Over the summer we "striped" the parking lot behind the church to identify specific parking without anyone having to worry about being blocked in when they come to Mass or a school event. We had previously increased parking spaces available by expanding our parking lot across from the church on Church St.

- We hired a new Youth Ministry Coordinator, David McHugh, who just happens to be married to Noelle (Garcia). Noelle was Youth Minister here a few years ago. Watch the next issue of The Shamrock for an interview with David.

- We're updating our computer servers.
- We're working to increase handicap seating in church. Hopefully that will be completed this fall.

- Stewardship of Time, Talent, and Treasure is gradually making headway in the parish as parishioners realize that tremendous blessings come when we are generous with all that God has given to us.

- We have made great strides both at the Parish and the School in establishing user-friendly and interesting websites.

And now for a little bit of dreaming...

- In the not too distant future we're looking at upgrading the lighting and sound system in church to enhance our worship experience.

- Something that some people have wanted for many years and after this hot summer it's become much more of a "hot" issue is to cool the church. We're hoping to accomplish this within the next 2-3 years

- We are in the process of upgrading the technology in the Parish Office and School which will take advantage of web-based software.

- I'd like to resurrect the "Mentoring" program for engaged couples as well as establish a Follow-up program for couples during their first five years of marriage. Parishes that have established such a program have seen a 90% decrease in divorces. All this of course depends on getting volunteers to step forward and want to get involved in making these two programs a reality.

Well, those are just some of the things we are doing and hope / dream to do in the upcoming months and years. I thought I'd just let everyone see the foundation you helped establish and upon which we are still building.


