All School Open House: The Open House will take place on Sunday, March 1, 2020 from 12:30-2:00pm. We are asking all school families to invite a family that does not currently attend St. Pat's to the open house. If a current family invites a family to the open house and they enroll, that family will receive out of dress code slips. If the new family stays for a full year and enrolls the following year, the referring family will receive a \$300 credit towards tuition. This does not apply to preschool. Both parties must sign a Student Referral Form.

Preschool and Kindergarten Open House: The Open House will take place in conjunction with the All School Open House on Sunday, March 1. Please meet in the Parish Hall at 1:00 p.m. for a short presentation. Teachers will be available to answer any questions. This open house replaces the evening open house that we held in previous years.

Faith & Future Scholarship: Beginning fall 2020, every kindergartner, 6th grader, and 9th grader in the diocese will be eligible for this scholarship. You must complete the <u>scholarship applica-</u> tion, subscribe to the <u>Catholic-Schools4U.org blog</u> and to the weekly newsletter from digital safety experts <u>Protect Young</u> <u>Eyes</u> and register at a catholic school before April 30, 2020. Registration information will be sent out soon.

I know online and in the news we have seen instances where students have been "shamed" for having a negative balance on their lunch account. Our system is set up to be a debit program as opposed to a credit Program, but I do understand that life happens and every now and then we all get a little behind. I have never, and will not ever, shame a child nor not feed a child. I will however reach out to you, the parent, to let you know that your child owes a balance. ACT Information for Juniors

Standard ACT No Accommodations (most Juniors)

On February 25th, all juniors, except those with specific accommodations, will be taking the ACT. Students should not go to their locker or any other part of the building. They will meet in the Parish Hall at 7:25 am and testing will begin promptly at 7:30 am. Juniors can dress comfortably and will be able to go home directly after the test. They are not allowed, for any reason, back in the building for the remainder of the school day. Please see the information below for more details.

PLEASE BRING: Number two pencils (no mechanical) and an approved calculator (TI-30, TI-34, TI-73, TI-82, TI-83, TI-84, TI-84 plus C, TI-Nspire any model excluding the CAS models, Casio, Casio Prizm, Casio 9750 GII, or Casio 9860 GII).

Students may also choose to bring a snack and water bottle.

ACT With Accommodations

Most students with specific accommodations for the ACT will be testing on February 26th. If the student's accommodated test date is a different date (February 28th), please check your email for more detailed information. Since the 26th is Ash Wednesday, we would like these students to attend mass at 7:30 and then go straight to the Parish Hall. Students will need to request missing work for this day in advance and can complete their work at home on the 25th (<u>no</u> Juniors are allowed in the building on the standard test date, February 25th). Testing may last through the end of the school day. In the rare event that this small group does not finish in one day, testing may extend to the next day.

PLEASE BRING: Lunch, Chromebook and charger, headphones, number two pencils (no mechanical) and an approved calculator (TI-30, TI-34, TI-73, TI-82, TI-83, TI-84, TI-84 plus C, TI-Nspire any model excluding the CAS models, Casio, Casio Prizm, Casio 9750 GII, or Casio 9860 GII).

Students may also bring a snack and water bottle.

ACT Timeline

February 25: Most of the juniors will meet in the Parish Hall at 7:25am to begin testing at 7:30am. Testing will be done by noon and they will leave the building. Students with accommodations will stay home and work on missing work for February 26th or 28th.

February 26: (only students with accommodations/all other students are in class) 7:30 – Mass...8:15 – Begin Testing...30 minute lunch break...2:20 or earlier – End Testing (testing might extend to the 27th if needed).
February 28: (one student with a different accommodation) 7:30 – Begin Testing...30 minute lunch
