<u>Canvas</u>: This year we are using a new learning management system. You received a few emails to help you set up a parent account. If you need to reset your child's email password, please call the office. If you followed the step-by-step directions that were last emailed out and it is not working for you, please contact the diocese at canvas@grcatholicschools.org.

<u>Busing</u> - There will be busing for St. Patrick students in the <u>morning only</u> on August 25-27 and no busing on August 28. We use the Portland Public School buses. When they are not in session, parents have to provide transportation for their children. If Portland Public Schools do not return to normal school days on August 31, busing will not be available.

<u>Free and Reduced Lunch Applications</u>: Every year we ask our parents to submit these forms. *It is extremely urgent that all families complete this form, even if you are not applying for free/reduced lunch, as it is tied to two important funding sources.* We receive discounts for our school and library as well as Title I and IIA funding. Elementary Student Drop Off:

Starting Monday, August 31st, please follow these new drop-off procedures:

The route shall be such that vehicles come in from the north and drop-off students curb-side on Church St. The line should be the same as pick-up by staging on West St. to Center St. and turning right on to Church St. Overflow should continue to utilize West St. near Alton Park.

In an effort to make for a continuous flow, vehicles should pull up to pre-designated spots marked with a cone (front of vehicle lines up with the cone) and have your student exit curbside, if possible.

We ask that the drivers stay in the vehicle so that the line can move continuously. Anyone wishing to exit their vehicle to assist their student(s) should utilize the parking lot next to the parish office and walk their student across the street and only cross to the steps just behind church. Be extremely mindful of the drivers pulling out and new vehicles pulling in.

Students, once exited, will be directed to walk up the ramp to the main office doors.

*We will not be using the ramp into the parking lot, even on inclement weather days. This is being done for student safety and also because of the reduced window of time for drop-off related to the current COVID procedures.

Anyone needing handicap access to the church or school will be allowed into the upper parking lot and flagged in to safely do so.

Please encourage everyone to be respectful of these new procedures, and share this information with fellow parishioners so we do not have bottlenecks with people parking on Church St. during these drop-off and pick-up times. We understand people would like to park close to church for morning Mass (Fridays, special days) however, this accommodation for the school drop-off & pick-up will ensure everyone gets to where they need to be on time.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED-PRICE SCHOOL MEALS

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. **Portland Public Schools** offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs \$1.35 Elem; \$1.60 HS/MS; lunch costs \$2.60 Elem; \$2.85 HS/MS. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced-price meals. Reduced-price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch.

- WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED-PRICE MEALS?
 - All children in households receiving benefits from the Food Assistance Program (FAP), Family Independence Program (FIP), or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) are eligible for free meals.
 - Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
 - · Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
 - Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
 - Children may receive free or reduced-price meals if your household's income is within the limits of the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced-price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.
