Parent/Teacher Conference Information: Conferences will take place on October 22 & 23. We ask that NO STUDENTS COME TO CONFERENCES WITH THEIR PARENTS. High school will have in-person conferences on 10/22 from 4:30-7:15pm and 10/23 from 12:00-2:45pm. Virtual appointments may be scheduled by the parent or teacher on 10/23 from 8:00-11:00am. Middle school conferences will be student-led at home. Portfolios will be sent home with students on 10/19. Parents will sign a form for their student to return to their teacher indicating that the conference was completed. Teachers will contact parents to set up virtual meetings for those who need more discussion. Parents may contact teachers to set up a meeting if they have concerns. **Elementary** school will have in-person conferences by appointment 4:30-7:15 pm on Thursday and 8:30 am - 2:45 pm on Friday. Virtual meetings will be scheduled for those parents who are uncomfortable attending an in-person meeting. Mr. Pettit (PE) (Friday only) and Mr. Art (Art) will be available during conferences.

<u>Calendar Change</u>: Please note that for the safety of our students, we will not have in-person classes on <u>Friday, October 23</u>, as scheduled, but will instead have a remote learning day. Students and parents are expected to login to Canvas on this day to obtain and complete assignments. This will prepare everyone for using Canvas in the event of another mandated school shutdown. Please make sure that you are set up in Canvas.

<u>School Masses are now live streamed</u>: Grades K-8 will sync virtually with Assumption in Belmont on Thursdays in October at 9 am for school Masses and the high school will hold Liturgy of the Word services while Fr. Mike is on vacation.




