St. Patrick Rice Bowl Project 2022



Each year the St. Patrick Junior High School helps put together the Rice Bowls for St. Patrick Parish. We are holding our 9th annual school wide Rice Bowl Project. (St. Patrick Parish has made the decision to not use the individual Rice Bowls this year, but we will continue with the project.)

The students will be provided a hotdog and chip lunch. This will be provided by the staff and student council of St. Patrick School. In the spirit of Lent we ask that a free will donation be contributed to the large Rice Bowl created for the project. One of the suggested Catholic Relief Services activities is eating a conservative family meal and giving the saved portion to the project. We are taking this idea and doing it as a school community Rice Bowl Project.

The recommended donation is what you would "normally spend" on your school lunch. Please bring your donation to school on Thursday, April 14th, when the hotdog lunch will be provided in the cafeteria.
