First Day of School

The first day of school and before and after school childcare for St. Patrick students is Tuesday, August 20. This is a full day of school for students in grades DK-12. Mass will be at 9:30a for DK-12 students. **Bus transportation will be available in the morning only on August 20 & 21.**

First Day of Preschool & Daycare

Students in grades 6-12 will meet in their first hour classroom, they can enter the school using door #7 beginning at 7:06 a.m.

Students in grades DK-5 will enter the school at the office doors beginning at 8:35 a.m. A daycare assistant will be on the blacktop at 8:20 a.m. for supervision. Please DO NOT drop off students before 8:20 a.m. Pick-up numbers will be available at the open house.

FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR STUDENTS, PLEASE DO NOT PARK OR DROP OFF STUDENTS IN THE BUS ZONE ON WEST STREET.

Class lists will be posted on the office doors by Aug. 14. Students can bring their school supplies to the open house.

Daily Schedule

Grades DK-5: 8:40 a.m. - 3:45 p.m.

- Elementary students are tardy if not in the classroom and ready to start the day by 8:40 a.m.
- Elementary students arriving more than 30 minutes late in the morning or leaving more than 30 minutes early in the afternoon will be marked absent for a half day; if missing 29 minutes or less they will be marked tardy.
- Elementary students attend Mass on Thursdays at 9:30 a.m. Shorts may not be worn to Mass. Public is welcome.

Grades 6-12: 7:30 a.m. - 2:20 p.m. (warning bell rings at 7:25 a.m., classes begin at 7:30)

- Middle school and high school students missing 15 minutes or more in a class period will be marked absent for that period; if missing 14 minutes or less they will be marked tardy.
- In order to participate in games and practices a student must be in school all day. If a student arrives 15 minutes after the start of class, he/she is considered late and late arrivals are treated as absences, and he/she will not be allowed to participate in extracurricular activities. Please consult the student handbook for exceptions.
- There are seven class periods and one lunch period.
- Grades 6-8 attend Mass on Thursdays at 9:30 a.m. and grades 9-12 attend Mass on Wednesdays at 9:30 a.m. Shorts may not be worn to Mass. Public is welcome.

Morning Drop-Off Procedure

Elementary Students (grades DK-5)

- Students dropped off before 8:20 a.m. must be signed in at before-school childcare in room 209. Elementary students can begin to be dropped off after 8:20 a.m. Supervision is provided from 8:20-8:35 a.m. They will enter the school at 8:35 a.m. and go directly to their classrooms. Parents should drop off their students by lining up around the school block, West St. to Center St. and use the cone area for drop off on Church St. **DO NOT BLOCK THE BUS ZONE** on West St.
- Parents may drop their children off in the parking lot near the office doors if barricades are not up. Please do not drop
 your children off on West Street, which is the bus drop-off point, unless you are dropping off for childcare, daycare,
 or preschool. Please drop off students on the correct side of the street, do not face in the wrong direction.
- Bused students are dropped off on West Street and enter door #7.
- Students are not permitted to be in the halls before or after school. Any students dropped off before 8:20 a.m. must report to before-school childcare and will be charged accordingly for the service.

Secondary Students (grades 6-12)

- Students should arrive no earlier than 7:06 a.m. and enter the school using door #7. DO NOT BLOCK THE BUS ZONE.
- High School students may drive to school and park in the lot across from Alton Park.

Dismissal Procedure

Elementary Students (grades DK-5)

- Non-bus riding students can be picked-up in their assigned location (Gym steps or Parish Hall) at 3:45 p.m. Directions and numbers will be available at the Open House.
- If you will be making alternate arrangements for student pick-up, please send a note to your child's teacher. For last minute arrangements email or call the school office at 647-7551 BEFORE 3:15 p.m. Please include your child's teacher, and both Mrs. Kinsman and Mrs. Pung on emails regarding changes to your child's pick-up only when it is a last minute change. If you do not receive a response, your child may be sent home the scheduled way.

- If a student will be participating in the afterschool bowling program at Meadow Bowl Lanes, please let the office know the change in their end of the day plans. The office will need to know each new session they sign up for.
- Students who are not picked up by 3:55 p.m. will be sent to after-school childcare in room 209. You will be charged accordingly for the service.
- Walkers are dismissed at 3:40 p.m. Bus riding students are dismissed from the West Street doors at 3:35 p.m. They are taken by one PPS shuttle bus to Westwood Elementary School where they transfer to the PPS bus that takes them to their final destination.

Secondary Students (grades 6-12)

- Non-bus riding students can be picked-up at 2:20 p.m. DO NOT PARK IN THE BUS ZONE.
- Bus riding students are dismissed at 2:20 p.m. They are taken by one PPS shuttle bus to Portland Middle School where they transfer to the PPS bus that takes them to their final destination.

PLEASE NOTE: Students may NOT be in the hallways unattended before or after school hours.

Before-School and After-School Childcare Program

- Before/After School Childcare is available in Room 209 (2nd floor). Parents can enter the building at entrance #6 (on West Street, closest to Grand River Ave.) by using the buzzer outside the door. Please note that new childcare forms need to be on file every year.
- Before-School Childcare is available from 6:30 a.m. 8:20 a.m. for grades DK-5; the cost is \$7.00/day/student.
- After-School Childcare is available from 3:45 p.m. 5:30 p.m. The cost is \$7.00/day/student.

Homework Room (grades 6-12)

- Students who do not complete a homework assignment will be required to go to homework room that day after school. The student will report to the teacher of the class where the homework was not completed. Homework room is from 2:20 p.m. 3:15 p.m.
- Upon being issued homework room, the student will go to the office to sign the homework room log and call home to inform their parents.
- If a student cannot serve homework room because of an appointment, they must talk with the teacher to arrange to serve it the next day.

Transportation

- Bused students are dropped off at St. Patrick in the morning by PPS buses. In the afternoon, they are taken by a PPS shuttle bus to a Portland Public School where they transfer to the PPS bus that takes them to their final destination. If you have any questions or changes regarding bus transportation, please contact the Portland Public Schools' bus garage at 647-2993.
- If your student will need a bus pass to ride home with someone else, please call the bus garage to make prior arrangements.
- High school students who will be riding the bus should contact the bus garage at 647-2993 to notify them and to arrangements.

Student Arrival and Departure (when arriving late or leaving early)

- Parking for drop-off and pick-up: for the safety of the children, the school/church parking lot will be closed for long-term parking during the school day. If the barricades are not blocking the ramp, you may pull into the parking lot for drop-off and pick-up. If the barricades are blocking the ramp, curbside parking is available outside the school and there is a parking lot next to the parish office.
- All students who are tardy or require early dismissal must sign-in/sign-out in the office. A parent or designee must accompany grades PS-8 to/from the office and sign them in or out.

Illnesses / Appointments / Absences / Medication

- Please notify the office of any allergies or medical conditions. If these conditions should be rectified, please let the office know.
- Parents should notify the school of a child's absence by calling the school office at 647-7551 BY 7:15 a.m. for grades 6-12, and BY 8:30 a.m. for grades PS-5.

- If a student will be absent due to illness, grades DK-8 parents may request to pick-up class assignments at the same time the absence is reported to the school office. Requested work will be available at the end of the school day. Students in grades 9-12 can access Canvas for class assignments that they miss while they are absent.
- Students cannot attend school if they have vomited, have diarrhea, or have a fever of 100° or above by mouth. They must be vomit, diarrhea, and fever free (without the use of medication) for 24 hours before returning to school.
- If you are aware of an absence lasting more than one day prior to the absence itself, please notify the teacher(s) to make arrangements and the office for attendance.
- Students who leave early or are out due to illness may not attend evening events hosted by St. Patrick School.
- Students in grades 5-12 involved in extra-curricular activities must be at school for the full day to participate in evening extra-curricular activities (exceptions include medical appointments and funerals).
- If it is necessary for a student to be excused from school for a medical or dental appointment, please send a written note to the elementary teacher. Students in grades 6-12 should take the request to the office.
- Medication

The school works with families to assist them in maintaining the health of their children who attend St. Patrick School. The school office personnel can administer prescription medication to students under the following conditions:

- Prescribed medication cannot be adjusted so that it can be administered at home.
- Parent and physician must complete the Prescription Medication Authorization form available in the school office.
- The parent/guardian has brought properly labeled, prescribed medication directly to the school office.
- Designated school personnel administer the prescribed medication in the school office.
- Written record is kept of all medication administered.

PLEASE NOTE: School personnel may not administer over-the-counter medications nor are students allowed to possess it during school hours without a medication authorization form.

Hot Lunch

- The daily hot lunch program is provided to St. Patrick School by Chartwells through Portland Food Service. Elementary hot lunch menus are sent home monthly with elementary students and high school/middle school menus are emailed to students and parents. The menus can be found on the homepage and respective grade page of the school website.
- Student lunches are \$2.75 for grades DK-5 and \$3.00 for grades 6-12. Milk is 60¢. (*Prices subject to change.) Middle
 and high school students who purchase extra food items will have to pay for the items at the time of purchase or have
 money in their account.
- Checks are to be made payable to Portland Food Service. Please do not combine a check to PFS with any money to be paid to St. Patrick School (field trip, tuition, etc.).
- Meal Magic Family Portal is your one-stop site for managing your child's meal account. Go to
 https://portland.familyportal.cloud/ where you can register for an account or click on tutorials for guidance. You can apply for free and reduced price lunch on here as well.

Recess

• Students are outside unless the weather prohibits (raining or the wind chill is below 0°F) in which case grades DK-5 remain indoors for recess. The students have recess at Alton Park or on the black top when the park is muddy, if there is a slight rain, or extreme wind. DK-5 students have recess immediately following lunch and one or two other times depending on classroom schedules.

Accessibility

- Parents can call the school office or e-mail classroom teachers directly to schedule appointments.
- All parents/visitors entering the building during school hours must sign-in and out in the office and obtain a visitor pass.

Infinite Campus/Report Cards

- The Infinite Campus website is https://micloud1.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/grcss.jsp. If you have forgotten your Infinite Campus password, please click on *Forgot Password* on the login page.
- You can access your student's grades, missing assignments, report cards, class schedules and attendance.
- Try the mobile app and get instant notifications of any updates. District = Diocese of Grand Rapids.
- Parents/guardians will be able to access their student(s) grades, progress reports and report cards on-line using Infinite Campus. Therefore, we will not be mailing these forms home. However, if you would like them mailed to you, please notify the school office (annual request).

School Newsletters/Correspondence

- Please take time to read the information that is sent to you via the principals, school or counselor office, and teachers. They contain information that is important to help the school year run smoothly.
- The school newsletters are emailed to our school families. You can also find them on the school website.
- You can also find us on Facebook: St. Patrick School Portland, Michigan.
- Elementary teachers send home a weekly class newsletter that has important information pertaining to your student.
- Middle School and High School email class information weekly.
- Text or Email Reminds. Don't miss out on important reminders and emergency information. For grades PS-8 text 81010 with the message @4464h2. For high school text 757.847.9886 with the message @793fhb. You can also receive them via email by going to remind.com. This app allows you to receive the messages in real time for emergencies and general information.
- We also have text and voice messages. You can log into your Infinite Campus portal account and update your contact preferences. (Click on the person icon in the top right corner, select settings, update contact preferences i.e.: email, text, voice.) This will be used primarily for school closings and emergencies. Other non-emergency information will continue to be sent using the Remind app.

Telephone Calls/Messages

- Students should be in their classroom, actively engaged in learning while they are in school. Therefore, we discourage students from using the telephone during the regular school day. Should a student need to call home, the teacher may issue a pass to use the office telephone. Unless there is an emergency, we will not forward calls to classrooms for students or teachers. Telephone messages will be delivered to students at times which do not interfere with their academic class schedule.
- If you have an unexpected change to your PS-5 student pick-up arrangements on a given day, **please send a note/email to your child's teacher.** If the change is last minute, you may call the school office before 3:00 p.m. Please include your child's teacher, and both Mrs. Kinsman and Mrs. Pung on emails regarding changes to your child's pick-up when it is a last-minute change. If you do not receive a response, your child may be sent home the scheduled way.

The office telephone may be used in case of emergency, such as illness or injury.

Morning prayers: 7:30-7:35 am & 8:45-8:50 am. Please do not phone the school office during these times.

Volunteers / Chaperones

In order for anyone to work with the students as a volunteer or chaperone, diocesan guidelines state that a mandatory criminal background check be done every five years. Also, anyone working with students must take an **online** session of "Protecting God's Children Awareness Session" (also known as VIRTUS) at http://www.virtus.org. Click on the "First Time Registrant" link and choose a virtual session. A background check and Standards of Ministerial Behavior is also included. Chaperones must have this completed at least two weeks before a field trip. The registration instructions can be found on the document/forms page on the website. If you have any questions, please call the school office at (517) 647-7551.

Scrip Purchases

Raiseright (formerly ShopWithScrip) is available to help reduce your tuition bill. Visit www.raiseright.com for a complete list of merchants and gift cards. You can register online at www.raiseright.com or use the mobile app RaiseRight to purchase gift cards at face value and receive a rebate to reduce your school tuition bill. Physical gift cards, electronic gift cards and reloadable gift cards are available. Raiseright rebate credits will be automatically applied to your account twice a year, in January and June. If you pay your tuition in full, the rebates will carry over to the next school year. Our code is 7A4F6C3B186. Sports Physicals

Each student in grade 5-12 participating in school athletics is required to have a MHSAA physical card on file in the office. Only physicals given after April 15th of the previous school year will be accepted for the current school year. No student can begin practices without a physical. Physical cards must be in the office and completely filled out in order for an athlete to participate.

Sports Passes

Sports' passes are available at the first home football and volleyball games. Sports passes permit you to enter all regular home games at no charge for one school year. A family pass can be purchased for \$250. Individual passes are \$100. All grandparents with student athletes in grades 5-12 and parishioners over the age of 62 may receive a sports pass free of charge. Grandparent orange sport passes do not expire. Families can earn sports passes by attending eight Athletic Association meetings and being actively involved.

Insurance Coverage Available

St. Patrick School carries a supplemental insurance policy that covers accidental bodily injury occurring during school, school-sponsored events and extra-curricular activities including traveling to/from these events. This insurance covers expenses over and above what your family's health insurance pays (co-pays, ER visit, ambulance, dental, etc.). Claim forms are available in the school office and must be filled out within 90 days of the incident.

Asbestos Information

In order to comply with the requirements of the EPA's Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, all of the school buildings in the Diocese of Grand Rapids have been inspected for asbestos-containing material. If you would like to review the management plan for St. Patrick School, it is available in the school office during regular school hours. The management plan states all recommended activities that will maintain the asbestos material in a non-friable condition.

Picture Day

Students in preschool - 5 will be photographed on **Tuesday, September 3**, preschool and grades 6-8 on **Wednesday, September 4**. High school students will be photographed on **Wednesday, August 14** during high school orientation. Picture re-take day is scheduled for Tuesday, October 22.


