#### First Day of School

The first day of school and before and after school childcare for St. Patrick DK-12 students is Wednesday, August 20. This is a full day of school. All students will attend Mass at 9:30 a.m. Bus transportation will be available in the morning only on August 20.

#### First Day of Preschool

Preschool will begin the week of Monday, August 25 Preschool - 8:30-11:30 a.m. & 12:30-3:30 p.m.

Students in grades 6-12 will meet in their first hour classroom, they can enter the school using door #7 beginning at 7:06 a.m.

Students in grades DK-5 will enter the school at the office doors beginning at 8:35 a.m. Supervision will start at 8:20 a.m. on the blacktop. Please DO NOT drop off students before 8:20 a.m. unless using childcare. Pick-up numbers will be available at the open house.

#### FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR STUDENTS, PLEASE DO NOT PARK OR DROP OFF STUDENTS IN THE BUS ZONE ON WEST STREET.

Class lists are posted on the office doors. Students can bring their school supplies to the open house.

St. Patrick School will present a sexual abuse prevention program, *Touching Safety*, to all students in two different session this school year. The creators of the *Protecting God's Children<sup>TM</sup>* program developed the *Touching Safety* program. This program is provided to us by the Diocese of Grand <u>Rapids, and</u> is a part of our ongoing effort to help create and maintain a safe environment for children and to protect all children from sexual abuse.



Parents or other family members (Grandparents, Aunts, Uncles) will need to take a Protecting God's Children\* session before they can attend field trips. <u>If you do not complete this at least two weeks before the event, you will be ineligible to attend</u>. You only have to do this one time and you will be good for the rest of your child (rens) field trips at St. Pats. Don't delay, do it now.

<sup>\*</sup> Protecting God's Children® for Adults is training conducted by VIRTUS certified facilitators on the prevention of child sexual abuse. The training makes participants aware of the signs of child sexual abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and five easy steps one can use to prevent child sexual abuse. Two videos are the centerpiece of the training: A Time to Protect God's Children™ and A Plan to Protect God's Children™. The facilitators incorporate policies and procedures into the training defining child sexual abuse, addressing the reporting of child sexual abuse, the screening and selection of employees and volunteers, and victim advocacy.

#### **Daily Schedule**

#### Grades DK-5: 8:40 a.m. - 3:45 p.m.

- Elementary students are tardy if not in the classroom and ready to start the day by 8:40 a.m.
- Elementary students arriving more than 30 minutes late in the morning or leaving more than 30 minutes early in the afternoon will be marked absent for a half day; if missing 29 minutes or less they will be marked tardy.
- Elementary students attend Mass on Thursdays at 9:30 a.m. Lunch is 11:50 a.m. 12:35 p.m.

Grades 6-12: 7:30 a.m. - 2:20 p.m. (warning bell rings at 7:25 a.m., classes begin at 7:30)

- Middle school and high school students missing 15 minutes or more in a class period will be marked absent for that period; if missing 14 minutes or less they will be marked tardy.
- There are seven class periods and one lunch period. Middle school lunch is 11:09 11:37 a.m. and High school lunch is 11:06 11:34 a.m.
- Grades 6-8 attend Mass on Thursdays at 9:30 a.m. and grades 9-12 attend Mass on Wednesdays at 9:30 a.m. and Fridays at 8:00 a.m.

Please call or email the school office if your child will be absent or late before 7:30 a.m. or 8:40 a.m.

#### **Morning Drop-Off Procedure**

#### **Elementary Students (grades DK-5)**

- Students dropped off before 8:20 a.m. must be signed in at before-school childcare in room 209 through door #6 on West Street. Elementary students dropped off after 8:20 a.m. will stay in the parking lot until 8:33 a.m. when they line up by grade outside the main entrance and teachers lead them to their classrooms, weather permitting. If it is raining or the wind chill is below 0°F the students come into the building for indoor recess until class begins.
- Parents may drop their children off by the ramp on Church Street or in the parking lot if barricades are not up.
  Please do not drop your children off on West Street, which is the bus drop-off point, unless you are dropping off for childcare or preschool.
- Bused students are dropped off on West Street and enter door #7.
- Students are not permitted to be in the halls before or after school. Any students dropped off before 8:20 a.m. must report to before-school childcare and will be charged accordingly for the service.

#### **Secondary Students (grades 6-12)**

- Students should arrive no earlier than 7:06 a.m.
- High School students may drive to school and park in the lot across from Alton Park.
- Students may enter the school at door #7 on West Street or at the school office entrance door #1.

#### **Dismissal Procedure**

#### **Elementary Students (grades DK-5)**

- Non-bus riding students can be picked-up in their assigned location (Gym steps or Parish Hall) at 3:45 p.m. Directions and numbers will be available at the open house in August.
- If you will be making alternate arrangements for student pick-up, please email or send a note to your child's teacher. For last minute arrangements call the school office at 647-7551 BEFORE 3:15 p.m. Please include your child's teacher, and both Mrs. Kinsman and Mrs. Pung on emails regarding changes to your child's pick-up when it is a last-minute change. If you do not receive a response, your child may be sent home the originally scheduled way.
- If a student will be participating in the afterschool bowling program at Meadow Bowl Lanes, please let the office know the change in their end of the day plans. The office will need to know each new session they are signed up.

- Students who are not picked up by 3:55 p.m. will be taken by their teacher to after-school childcare in room 209. You will be charged accordingly for the service.
- Walkers are dismissed at 3:40 p.m. Bus riding students are dismissed from the West Street doors at 3:40 p.m. They are taken by a PPS shuttle bus to Westwood Elementary School where they transfer to the PPS bus that takes them to their final destination.

#### Secondary Students (grades 6-12)

- Non-bus riding students can be picked-up at 2:20 p.m. DO NOT PARK IN THE BUS ZONE.
- Bus riding students are dismissed at 2:20 p.m. They are taken by a PPS shuttle bus to Portland Middle School where they transfer to the PPS bus that takes them to their final destination.

PLEASE NOTE: Students may NOT be in the hallways unattended before or after school hours.

#### Before-School and After-School Childcare Program (grades DK-5)

- Before/After School Childcare is available in room 209 (2<sup>™</sup> floor). Parents can enter the building at entrance #6 (on West Street, closest to Grand River Ave.). New childcare forms need to be on file every year.
- Before-School Childcare is available from 6:30 a.m. 8:20 a.m. for grades DK-5; the cost is \$7.50/day/student.
- After-School Childcare is available from 3:45 p.m. 5:30 p.m. The cost is \$7.50/day/student.
- Students must be signed in or out by a parent or designee. This is a state licensing requirement.

#### Homework Room (grades 6-12)

- Students who do not turn in an assignment or the assignment is incomplete are <u>required</u> to stay after school to complete the assignment in the classroom where the homework was not completed the same day the assignment is due. Homework room is from 2:20 p.m. 3:15 p.m. Tuesday Friday.
- Upon being assigned homework room, the student will go to the office to sign the homework room log and call
  home to inform their parents.
- If a student cannot serve homework room because of an appointment, they must talk with the teacher to arrange to serve it the next day.

#### Transportation

- Bused students are dropped off at St. Patrick in the morning by PPS buses. In the afternoon, they are taken by a PPS shuttle bus to a Portland Public School where they transfer to the PPS bus that takes them to their final destination. If you have any questions or changes regarding bus transportation, please contact the Portland Public Schools' bus garage at 647-2993.
- If your student will need a bus pass to ride home with someone else, please call the bus garage to make prior arrangements.
- High school students who will be riding the bus should contact the bus garage at 647-2993 to notify them and make arrangements.

#### Student Arrival and Departure (when arriving late or leaving early)

- Parking for drop-off and pick-up: for the safety of the children, the school/church parking lot will be closed for long-term parking during the school day. If the barricades are not blocking the ramp, you may pull into the parking lot for drop-off and pick-up. If the barricades are blocking the ramp, curbside parking is available outside the school and there is a parking lot next to the parish office.
- For students who are tardy or require early dismissal: a parent or designee must pick-up and return the student through the main office (parent or designee must accompany grades DK-8 to/from the office and sign them in or out).

#### Illnesses / Appointments / Absences / Medication

• Parents should notify the school of a child's absence by calling the school office at 647-7551 BY 8:30 a.m. for grades DK-5, and BY 7:15 a.m. for grades 6-12. This includes students who will be tardy.

- If a student will be absent due to illness, you may request to pick-up class assignments at the same time the absence is reported to the school office. Requested work may be available at the end of the school day. High school students can access Canvas for class assignments that they miss while they are absent.
- Students can not attend school if they have vomited, have diarrhea, or have a fever of 100° or above by
  mouth. Students must be vomit, diarrhea and fever free (without the use of fever reducing medicine) for 24 hours
  before returning to school.
- Students who leave early or are out due to illness may not attend evening events hosted by St. Patrick School.
- Students in grades 5-12 involved in extra-curricular activities must be at school for the full day to participate in evening extra-curricular activities (exceptions include medical appointments and funerals).
- Medication

The school works with the families to assist them in maintaining the health of their children who attend St. Patrick School. The school office personnel can administer prescription medication to students under the following conditions:

- Prescribed medication cannot be adjusted so that it can be administered at home.
- The parent and physician must complete the Prescription Medication Authorization form available in the school office. A new form must be completed each year.
- The parent/guardian has brought properly labeled, prescribed medication directly to the school office.
- Designated school personnel administer the prescribed medication in the school office.
- Written record is kept of all medication administered.
- If your child is capable/responsible to self-administer medication, an additional form is available for a student to self-possess medication at school.

PLEASE NOTE: School personnel may not administer over-the-counter medications nor are students allowed to possess it during school hours.

#### **Hot Lunch**

Lunch Schedule: High School: 11:06-11:34 a.m. • Grades 6 - 8: 11:09-11:37 a.m. • Grades DK - 5: 11:50-12:35 p.m.

- The daily hot lunch program is provided to St. Patrick School by Chartwells through Portland Food Service. Hot lunch menus can be found on the homepage of the school website and are emailed to students and parents.
- Elementary student price is \$2.75. Milk may be purchased for \$.60. Please send money in an envelope to elementary teachers.
- Middle school and high school student price is \$3.00. Milk may be purchased for \$.60. A la carte items may be purchased for an additional cost. Lunch choices will be submitted first hour. Money will also be collected at this time.
- Checks are to be made payable to Portland Food Service. Please do not combine a check to PFS with any money to be paid to St. Patrick School (field trip, tuition, etc.).
- You can check your hot lunch balance or add money to it by logging in to your account at
   <u>https://portland.familyportal.cloud/</u>. Account information for new families will be provided before school starts in
   the fall.

#### Recess

Students are outside unless the weather prohibits (raining or the wind chill is below 0°F) in which case grades DK-5 remain indoors for recess. The students have recess at Alton Park, the grassy areas across the street from the school, or on the black top. DK-5 students have recess immediately following lunch and either in the morning or afternoon depending on classroom schedules.

#### Infinite Campus / Report Cards

If you have forgotten your Infinite Campus password, please click on Forgot Password on the login page. Login information for new families will be sent out before school starts in the fall.

- You can access your student's grades, missing assignments, report cards, class schedules and attendance.
- Try the mobile app and get instant notifications of any updates after you set up your account. District = Diocese of Grand Rapids.
- Parents/guardians (and students) will be able to access their student(s) grades, progress reports and report cards
  on-line using Infinite Campus. Therefore, we will not be mailing these home. However, if you would like them mailed
  to you, please notify the school office (annual request).

#### **Canvas**

Canvas is a learning management system that provides easy access to a student's learning. Students and parents in grades 9-12 can access lessons, assignments, resources, and coursework within this tool. Canvas also integrates with our students' Infinite Campus and Google accounts. Please see the school website under Academics for step-by-step directions for parents to connect to their children's account.

#### **School Newsletters / Correspondence**

- Please take time to read the information that is sent to you from the Principals, school or counselor office, and teachers. They contain information that is important to help the school year run smoothly.

For high grades 6-12 text 757.847.9886 with the message @793fhb. You can also receive them via email by going to remind.com. This app allows you to receive messages in real time for emergencies and general information.
- Information is emailed from Infinite Campus to our families. Emergency information will be sent via text message. If you have any changes in addresses, email addresses, or phone numbers, please notify the school office.

#### Accessibility

- Parents can call the school office or e-mail classroom teachers directly to schedule appointments.
- All parents/visitors entering the building during school hours must sign-in and out in the office and obtain a visitors pass.
- Our website is your source for up-to-date information: portlandstpats.com.

#### **Volunteers / Chaperones**

In order for anyone to work with the students as a volunteer or chaperone, diocesan guidelines state that a mandatory criminal background check be done every three years. Also, anyone working with students must take an online session of "Protecting God's Children Awareness Session" (also known as VIRTUS). Raise Right (formerly ShopWithScrip) is available to help reduce your tuition bill. Visit <a href="www.raiseright.com">www.raiseright.com</a> for a complete list of merchants and gift cards. You can register online at <a href="www.raiseright.com">www.raiseright.com</a> or use the mobile app <a href="RaiseRight">RaiseRight</a> to purchase gift cards at face value and receive a rebate to reduce your school tuition bill. Physical gift cards, electronic gift cards and reloadable gift cards are available. Rebate credits will be automatically applied to your account twice a year, in January and June. If you pay your tuition in full, the rebates will carry over to the next school year. #### **Sports Physicals**

Each student in grade 5-12 participating in athletics is required to have a MHSAA physical card on file in the office. Only physicals given after April 15th of the previous school year will be accepted for the current school year. No student can begin practice without a physical. Physical cards must be in the office and completely filled out in order for an athlete to participate.

#### **Sports Passes**

Sports passes are available at the first home football and volleyball games. Sports passes permit you to enter all home games at no charge for one school year. A family pass can be purchased for \$250. Individual passes are \$100. All grandparents with student athletes in grades 5-12 and parishioners over the age of 62 may receive a sports pass free of charge.

#### **Insurance Coverage Available**

St. Patrick School carries a supplemental insurance policy that covers accidental bodily injury occurring during school, school-sponsored events and extra-curricular activities including traveling to/from these events. This insurance covers expenses over and above what your family's health insurance pays (co-pays, ER visit, ambulance, dental, etc.). Claim forms are available in the school office and must be filled out within 90 days of the incident.
