# Virtue Corner

Welcome to the Virtue Corner! Next week we will begin diving into our virtues! For now, we are learning about the overarching Theological Virtues and Cardinal Virtues. It is our hope that this little corner becomes a way for you to share in this amazing journey towards holiness with us!

## **Theological Virtues:**

- Faith: Virtue by which we believe in God and believe all that He has said and revealed to us.
- Hope: Virtue by which we desire the Kingdom of Heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises.
- Charity (or love): Virtue by which we love God above all things for His own sake and our neighbor as our self for the love of God.

### **Cardinal Virtues:**

- Prudence: Find the good in every situation and choose to do it.
- Temperance: Balance our use for created things using them in moderation and for good.
- Fortitude: Strength to resist temptation, overcome obstacles, and conquer fears.
- Justice: Give both God and neighbor everything they deserve.

God gives the growth in each of the virtues. He gives us the virtues of faith, hope, and charity at our baptism and increases them in response to our asking. He is a loving God after all who created us with free will. It is our duty to exercise that free will to choose Him. These virtues are free gifts from the Holy Spirit! Let's not leave these gifts unopened and instead take them and spread His goodness to our little corner of the world!

In cooperating with His grace (His very life within us) that we receive in the sacraments and through prayer, we grow in the cardinal virtues of prudence, temperance, fortitude, and justice. Underneath each of these virtues are sub-virtues (think humility, patience, modesty, generosity, obedience, etc.) that help us exercise self-discipline and eventually self-mastery over our own desires. Throughout this school year, we will take intentional time to learn about and grow in each of these virtues through knowledge and self discipline to become the unique and unrepeatable individuals we were created to be! As St. Ignatius of Antioch said "Exercise self discipline, for you are God's athlete; the prize is immortality and eternal life, as you know full well."
