The yearly St. Patrick School Calendar is here.

Half day dismissal change on Oct. 23: There is a funeral at 12:00 pm on Thursday, October 23. The dismissal procedure for this day is being changed to accommodate traffic flow. Please see the email that was sent to you on Oct. 15th.

Parent/Teacher Conferences: Conferences will be held on Thursday, October 23. High School conferences are on a walk-in basis in the teacher's classrooms. <u>2026-27 Financial Aid Applications</u>: The <u>application</u> and <u>instructions</u> were emailed to all families. The deadline for round one is December 1, 2025. This applies for students in grades DK-11. **A new application must be filled out each year**. <u>Picture Retake Day</u>: Pictures were sent home this week. If you didn't like your picture or were absent, picture retake day is on Tuesday, October 28. For those students who would like to get their picture retaken and bought a package, they <u>MUST</u> bring their package to the photographer for an even exchange, as pictures will not be reprinted unless those are returned.

## Virtue Corner

#### Virtue of the Week: Orderliness

This falls under the cardinal virtue of temperance, which helps us moderate or balance the use of created goods.

**Definition**: Keeping oneself physically clean and neat and one's belongings in good order. Bearing present difficulties calmly.

#### Ways to Cultivate:

- Establish order in one's daily life; keep one's space and appearance orderly and clean
- Pick up after yourself and get rid of unneeded items.
- Does my daily routine start with prayer?
- Use a planner to keep track of your homework, responsibilities, and appointments.
- Clean up before your parents ask.
- Leave things in order, for example: make your bed each morning.
- Prioritize activities and make sure you have times set aside for the things that are most important, like prayer.

#### Scripture: Luke 15:8-9

"Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp and sweep the house and seek diligently until she finds it? And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, "Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin which I had lost."

#### Saint: St. Raymond of Peñyafort

Raymond was a Dominican priest who helped train seminarians to be priests. Pope Gregory IX asked him to help with a large project. None of the Church's laws were organized. During his spare time, Raymond collected and organized all the decrees of the Church. His book was used as the main reference for the next eight hundred years.


