<u>Veterans Day</u>: St. Patrick School will have a ceremony to honor local Veterans on Nov. 11 at 10 am. The ceremony and reception is open to Veterans and their families. Students may wear a red, white, and blue shirt with dress code bottoms.

<u>Please Dress for the Weather</u>: Please be aware of the weather each morning. Students should wear jackets on colder mornings. Students are required to go outside with the rest of the class regardless if they have a jacket or not.

School closing phone calls: Portland Public Schools has an automated phone system that automatically calls parents to inform them of school closings. St. Patrick students enrolled in shared time classes (gym, art, music) are automatically placed in their system and will receive a text and call when Portland Public Schools will be closed. If the call is due to inclement weather, St. Patrick School is automatically closed as well. Please be aware that there may be occasions when you may receive a call when it does not affect our students. For example, if St. Patrick School is not in session and PPS cancels due to a snow day. Or PPS is closed for a reason that would not close St. Patrick School such as a power outage. Please be conscious of what the closing is for and if it affects St. Patrick School. Phone calls will go out to all people in their system. St. Patrick School also sends an email and text message in the event of any closing after we are notified. You may receive more than one notification.

Hallowtide



Did you know we as Catholics have great cause for celebration for THREE days this week?! Our Catholic celebrations are vastly different from what the secular world has turned Halloween into, but we have great reason to CELEBRATE!

Here is the breakdown of our three days of Hallowtide:

- October 31: Halloween, or All Hallow's ("hallow" meaning "holy") Eve is when the church begins celebrating All Saints Day, similar to Christmas Eve, the time in which the Church begins celebrating Christmas Day!
- November 1: All Saints Day is a major feast day, a holy day of obligation- which is meant
 to be celebrated with joyful celebration! On this day, we honor all of the Saints
 (canonized) and saints (not canonized) living in heaven with our Lord. The Saints
 provide us with immense hope for our own eternity! Most years this is a Holy Day of
 Obligation (which means we attend Mass to worship our Lord) but because of the day it
 falls on, it is not for 2025.
- November 2: We celebrate All Souls Day where we commemorate and pray for the souls in purgatory. We pray that their time of purification will be complete and they can enter into the Kingdom of Heaven with our beloved saints we honored the day before!

Ideas when celebrating All Hallows Eve and Hallowtide:

- Pray for those whose doors you are walking up to for trick or treating.
 Pray for the dead family members who may still be in purgatory.
- Take a walk through the cemetery praying the Rosary for the souls in purgatory there.
- Simply remember what it is we are actually celebrating and spread His hope through our costumes, our speech, and the joy we have that night!



This is a great time to remember that this life we are living here on earth is but a fraction of time compared to our eternity. We have been given a gift of being born at this time, in this moment and we shouldn't waste it! There is a saying you will hear in many Catholic spheres, "Momento Mori" – which means "remember your death." How we show Christ's love to those He puts in our path matters. Make each encounter and each moment count!

Keeping Our Kids Safe

Protecting God's Children for Adults training is conducted by the VIRTUS certified facilitators on the prevention of child sexual abuse. The training makes participates aware of the signs of child sexual abuse, the methods and means by which offenders commit abuse, and five easy steps one can use to prevent child sexual abuse. It is our duty to ensure that all children live in a safe environment. To do so, we need to be armed with knowledge on how to recognize the signs of abuse and what to do if we suspect abuse.

All parish/school staff are **required** to take a safe environment training session. All parish/school volunteers are **required** to take a safe environment training session. This training session can be done online at **www.virtus.org**. It takes about two hours to complete and is a one time training. You will be asked to register and set up a new account. The forms that are required to be signed can all be done electronically.

If you have school students and would like to attend field trips/school events, this training needs to be completed two weeks prior to the event, **no exceptions**, so don't delay and do it now!


