Opposing Trait:


• Failing to recognize the gifts of others; being too proud or having false humility.

There is busing to school on exam days, but students will need a ride home after exams.

Please also note the following:

- All high school students are expected to have an exam during their scheduled exam time
 unless not having an exam has been approved by the administration. The only exceptions
 would be students taking a dual enrollment college course or a Michigan Virtual H.S.
 course (assuming they have completed the course work for that class). If a student does
 not have an exam scheduled, they should not be in the school during that time.
- Students in grades 9-12 will be allowed to leave the building as soon as their second exam
 of the day is complete EXCEPT on Friday. On Friday, all students who have a first hour exam
 are REQUIRED to stay for Mass.

Dear Friends in Christ,

In these final days of Advent, the season of hope, we reflect on how the Jubilee Year has reminded us that "Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God's love" (Spes non confundit, 3).
